- 2. Speed warning sign Whittlesey Road Peterborough City Council Highways have given alternative installations costs as:

Return the current sign and replace with a battery version. This would come with 2x batteries, charger and protective cover. This option would be an additional £420
Permanent fixed solar sign. For this they would send a kit and it would need installing on the existing sign. This option is £1494 + fitting fee.

3: Return the current sign and replace with a portable solar unit. This would be an additional £1200.

All these options will still need a new post installation. This would cost £333.12.

The alternatives were discussed at length and it was agreed that permanent solar sign would be requested and a confirmed costing obtained including installation. Also to confirm the data feedback that can be received from this indicator. Cllr Parker suggested splitting the cost 50/50 between the City Cllr funding and a Parish Council contribution and this was agreed.
