Public discussion - Gemma Birley, Project Manager, PECT – presented the barriers and potential solutions to cutting carbon in homes and transport and moving towards a cleaner and greener Peterborough.

Looking to host workshops/ discussion groups in Thorney to gauge Parish opinion on 'net zero' in Peterborough and the barriers to saving energy, working with residents to help overcome any barriers. Looking to hold these around the middle of December. Ms Birley will contact the Parish Council with potential dates and the Parish Council will liaise with Bedford Hall for availability and potential groups.

Residents raised their concerns over the condition of the tennis courts. Cllr Ormston advised he can obtain a quotation for the resurfacing of the court from Peterborough CC. Cllr Allen advised that Peterborough CC budgets will not allow renovations. A resident advised they had tried to obtain LTA funding, but they were unsuccessful. It was agreed to obtain quotations for repairs (Cllr Ormston and local group) and look at funding sources.

Conifer trees outside 63 Wisbech Road/ on corner of Woburn Drive- a resident advised these were growing out of control and wanted to know who is responsible for their maintenance. Peterborough City Cllrs Ormiston and Allen will investigate ownership.

# 2. Planning Applications and other matters.

24/01405/FUL Crow Tree Farm North Side Thorney - Proposal: Proposed change of use of an agricultural building and associated operations to a 1.5 storey residential dwelling (Class C) – no objection

24/01326/FUL 3 - 11 Station Road Thorney - Externally applied wall insulation with render finish similar to existing building, with render to be SOLTHERM SFCP (BAZA 30) RAL 9003 (white)

Numbers 3-11 Station Road are Duke of Bedford cottages that have undergone some unflattering modern alterations to windows and doorways, but they retain the character of the cottages with the local buff/yellow brick, brick voussoirs in the window and doorway heads and slate roofs. The application title, application form and heritage statement refer to a render finish, with the first two referring to the render being painted white. In this conservation area, external insulation with painted render finish seems highly inappropriate for these cottages and it is hard to believe it would be accepted by Conservation Officers. However, the submitted plans for the proposed elevations contradict the other documents and show a "brick slip finish (colour to be confirmed)". As long as the brick slips are genuine brick to match the existing, including the window heads, and not some form of synthetic panels, the appearance would not be dramatically changed and could be acceptable. If approved, conditions should require that the details should be agreed with the Conservation Officers before work begins.

Another error, the application form describes the roof as being concrete pan tiles whereas the photographs and Google Street View show a slate

This application should be withdrawn and resubmitted without errors and inconsistencies and with more detail so the application can be properly assessed. As it stands Thorney Parish Council objects.
